Any exhibitors requiring assistance with their entries are most welcome at the pavilion on the Thursday evening prior to show.

Classes 1 - 100 to be grown by exhibitor or have been in their possession for 3 months. For novice classes the exhibitor can not have won three first prizes in that section. At the discretion of the judge a prize may not be awarded, judge's decision is final.

Definitions: NND - Not Necessarily Distinct; D - Distinct Colour/Variety; AV - Any Variety; AOV - Any Other Variety

PRIZES: Classes 1 - 100: First - \$3 plus card, Second - \$1 plus card.

Classes 101 - 118: First - \$5 plus card, Second - \$3 plus card.

Classes 119 - 126: First - \$3 plus card and ribbon, Second - \$1 plus card and ribbon.

DECORATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

Guidelines for Competitors

Exhibits judged on interpretation of schedule, creativity, originality, principles and elements of design. Plant material should predominate over all other components in a design.

Exhibits must be the individual exhibitors own work. No artificial plant material may be used (i.e. manufactured or artificial flowers/foliage unless specified). Fresh plant material must be in water or water retaining material that does not alter the effect of the arrangement.

A design must not be changed in any way after it is judged. Open to professionals and others. Exhibitors may compete above their section but not below. Flowers not necessarily home grown unless stated. The judge's decision is final.
