## RULES & CONDITIONS

- An entry form must be completed. If your number of entries exceed \$10 in classes 1-100, you still only pay \$10.
- Containers and collections must have at least 5 cuts.. Clear bottles available but not containers.
- Help available on Thursday evening if required.
- Classes 1 - 100 to be grown by exhibitor or have been in their possession for 3 months.
- For novice classes the exhibitor can not have won three first prizes in that section.
- At the discretion of the judge a prizemay not be awarded, judge's decision is final.
- **Definitions:** NND - Not Necessarily Distinct; D - Distinct Colour/Variety; AV - Any Variety; AOV - Any Other Variety.

- Classes 1 - 100: First - \$3 and place card, Second - \$1 and place card.
- Class 101 - 116: First - \$5 and place card, Second - \$3 and place card. Except trophy classes
- Classes 117 - 118: Ribbons & Cards

Guidelines for Competitors. Exhibits judged on interpretation of schedule, creativity, originality, principles and elements of design. Plant material should predominate over all other components in a design. Exhibits must be the individual exhibitors own work. No artificial plant material may be used (i.e. manufactured or artificial flowers/foilage unless specified). Fresh plant material must be in water or water retaining material that does not alter the effect of the arrangement. A design must not be changed in any way after it is judged. Open to professionals and others. Exhibitors may compete above their section but not below. Flowers not necessarily home grown unless stated. The judge's decision is final. If help required regarding the Manual, please contact the stewards.
